## WET SEASON NASTIES

With the rain comes a number of pests including mozzies and weeds. If you find yourself with a few extra minutes (and the inclination), there are some easy things you can do to help maintain the grounds:

**Mosquitos** - make sure there is no standing water for mozzies to breed in.

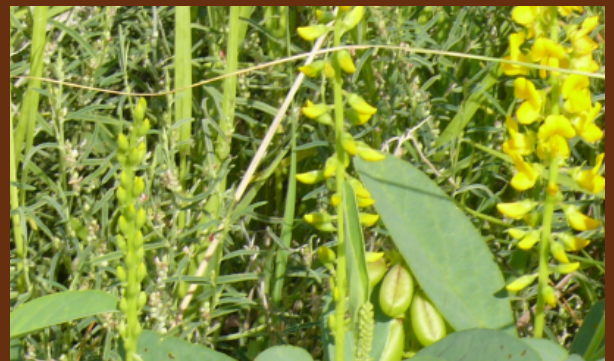
**Weeds to remove immediately:**

- **Rattlepod Weed** - a potentially lethal weed that can cause "walkabout disease" in horses.
- **Bellyache Bush** - poisonous to livestock including horses.
- **Laucaena** - can cause skin issues and hair loss. These can grow into large trees (we know there's a few on the grounds that we're in the process of removing).

Please do not put weeds into the manure pile or leave them laying around. Old feed bags are perfect for collecting the weeds before binning them.
