GRAZING PADDOCKS NOW OPEN

Horses must be secured at all times.

NEW YARD NUMBERS! Some yard numbers will be changing to remove the a's & b's still around as well as create a better "flow" to the order. Also included are two potential new yards to accommodate new agistees.



Plumbing Upgrade

All plumbing throughout the grounds is being replaced starting this month. Here's what you need to know:

- There will be a trencher coming to dig trenches for new pipes in front of yards in sections. This will take 2-5 days from start to finish at which point horses must remain in their yards for safety. An estimated schedule will be provided to all agistees.
- The plumber will be following behind the trencher installing pipes, meters & taps.
- It is the agistee's responsibility to back fill the trench in front of their yard: Club participation is required to fulfill the conditions of the grant we received.

New Agistees:

Jutta & Pascal are back! They've secured yard 2. Their new horse, Jasper, will be up on the first Granthams truck! Please make them feel welcome when you see them!

GROUNDS MANAGEMENT PLAN

Part of what the committee has been working on lately is a short & long term plan to get the weed species of trees under control.

Agistees will receive the full plan in the near future which will outline required action. Here's an overview of our 1, 5 & 10 year management plan:

1 Year Goals:

- All Coffee Bush Trees to be removed from yards & grounds
- Establish a nursery to grow our own tree stock.
- Agistees encouraged to start planting shade trees to replace large Neems in coming years.

5 Year Goals:

- 50% of all neem trees in yards to be removed.
- All neem trees in grounds to be removed.

10 Year Goals:

- All neem trees have been removed from Broome Rodeo Grounds.

*BHRC will aim to supplement shade trees from surplus nursery stock to agistees.

- Researching available grants for grounds improvements including ablution blocks, clubhouse, fire breaks and more.
